ACADEMIC AUTHORITIES

THE EDUCATIONAL OFFER

Like most potential students, you want to have a clear idea of what subject you are interested in pursuing. At this point we present you different modes of study.

Some of our courses (also in English) are available via distance learning, also known as e-learning. Every CUT student can take e-learning courses.

Currently students can choose from 25 degree courses among 7 faculties, at 4 faculties studies are available in English; full-time and extramural, at first cycle studies (degree of engineer or BSc), at second cycle studies (MSc) and – when individually arranged - at third cycle degree courses (PhD). CUT also offers postgraduate courses.

The first degree studies last 3 or 3,5 years and are conducted in full-time and extension modes, and end with obtaining the Eng. or BSc degree.

Master programme (second cycle) means a second cycle programme of higher education that follows a first degree or an equivalent level of learning leading to master level offered by a higher



education institution. The second degree studies lasts 1,5 or 2 years and end with obtaining MSc degree.

The doctoral programme (third cycle) means a research-related programme of higher education study that follows a higher education degree and leads to a doctoral degree (PhD) offered by a higher education

institution. PhDs are arranged on individual request, after consulting the possible thesis with selected faculty dean's office.

APPLYING FOR CUT BY FOREIGNERS

We aim to make the application process for all our degrees as simple as possible, with comprehensive information and sources of support available to you. We are firmly committed to providing a positive learning environment that is free of discrimination of any kind, or harassment, where all students are treated with respect and dignity. We ensure an equal access to the full range of institutional facilities for all our students. If you need an information concerning recognition of foreign educational qualifications in Poland visit: www.nauka.gov.pl/en and www.go-poland.pl/admission-requirements.

General requirements for admission to degree programs offered by higher education institutions in Poland are the same for all universities. The candidate must hold a matriculation certificate or another equivalent document attesting that the holder is eligible for admission to higher education in the country in which he or she completed secondary school.

For registration on CUT and first important information, please contact a selected Dean's Office. To get a student ID card you need to make a payment (17 zł) via bank transfer or at the post office (e.g. in Galeria Krakowska).

IMPORTANT DATES

The academic year at Cracow University of Technology starts at the beginning of October and ends in late September. The academic year is divided into two semesters, a winter semester and a summer semester.

The winter semester starts at the beginning of October and continues until early March of the following year. The summer semester starts in March and finishes in the end of September.

Exam Sessions are scheduled for first two weeks of February and last two weeks of June.

For candidates from abroad, applying for studies on rules other than applicable to Polish national, the last day of June is the end of application round for diploma programme studies (undergraduate, first cycle) carried out in Polish and Master studies in English at the Faculty of Physics, Mathematics and Computer Sciences.

The documents necessary to confirm the registration for the undergraduate studies (B.Sc. 1st cycle) and graduate studies (MSc, 2nd cycle) are: Application Form, Passport and other required documents from the Application Procedure sheet. It is obligatory to send required documents till the 30th of June, by the e-mail: gkarcz@pk.edu.pl

There are different rules concerning the Faculty of Architecture – the documents necessary to confirm the registration for

undergraduate studies (BSc, 1st cycle) are:

It is obligatory to send the required documents till the last day of May, by e-mail bwm@pk.edu.pl Architectural predispositions entrance exams for foreign candidates take place in June and they are held on CUT main campus. AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Polish government scholarship

If you want to receive the scholarship, you must contact the Polish embassy in your home country. The Polish Government Scholarship will not only pay your tuition fees but also give you a monthly allowance, which will cover some of your everyday living costs. The significant condition of obtaining is an examination in Polish language and a general knowledge test.

Moreover, if you are of Polish origin and if this can be verified by Polish Consulate or Embassy, you are entitled to a lower fee at a university in Poland.

You must keep in mind that the scholarship may be paid with 3 months delay, so you have to ensure your financial needs during this period of time.

2. A scholarship within Erasmus programme (only for EU students and students from Island, Norway, Lichtenstein and Turkey)

In order to be accepted as a ERASMUS exchange student, you must be a student of a partner university which has signed a ERASMUS Bilateral Agreement with CUT.

The candidates are requested to complete the Application Form for Incoming Students and return it together with The Learning Agreement (your university form), English Language Certificate (required B1 level) and two passport-size photographs to the ERASMUS office at CUT. YOUR STAY IN CRACOW AND ACCOMMODATION

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO BEFORE ARRIVING IN CRACOW?

- Make sure your ID/passport is valid
- Obtain a proper visa/residence permit (if necessary)
- Purchase your ticket for travel to Cracow
- Buy some Polish ZŁOTY in order to have some Polish money when you arrive. You will need them if you plan on taking a bus or taxi from the airport

RESIDENCE PERMITS

EU NATIONALS

Students from the EU (plus Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland) are exempt from student visa requirements. If you are a citizen of EU member state the only thing you need to enter Poland is a valid document confirming identity and citizenship (i.e. your national ID or passport). For a stay shorter than 3 months there are no formal requirements. Nationals of the EU staying in Poland for a period exceeding 3 months have the obligation to register their stay with the Voivodship (Provincial) Office.

Required Documents:

EU nationals should provide:

- application (1 original + 3 photocopies),
- photocopy of a valid travel document (the pages with personal details) or another document confirming identity and citizenship,
- confirmation of a temporary stay registration,
- certificate from a public, non-public college or a referral professional training course confirming admission,
- a document confirming medical insurance coverage,
- a written declaration that the person has sufficient financial resources to provide for himself/herself and his/her family members, without the necessity to avail of social assistance services, or a certificate confirming such financial resources.

The documents should be submitted in person at the Foreigners' Affairs Unit of the Department of Nationals' and Foreigners' Affairs of Małopolska Provincial Office in Cracow, ul. Przy Rondzie 6 (ground floor, foreigners' affairs room).

Fees

Application, appendices and issue of EU nationals stay certificate are not subject to a stamp duty.

NON-EU STUDENTS are required to obey the rules issued by the Immigration Office in their home country. The two main documents you need to enter Poland are a valid travel document (passport) and a visa (if required).

Visa

Non-EU students wishing to study in Poland should apply for an entry visa. All students should legalize their stay exceeding 3 months by obtaining temporary residence permit after their arrival to Poland. More information on http://www.msz.gov.pl/en/travel_to_poland/

PESEL number

International students who have registered their residence in the territory of Poland for more than 3 months obtain a PESEL identification number.

The PESEL number should be obtained three weeks after registering residence at the residents registering office in Referat Ewidencji Ludności (Population Records Office) at al. Powstania Warszawskiego 10, Cracow.

HEALTH/MEDICAL INSURANCE

Health insurance is compulsory for all students of the CUT. It is also in your own best interest. For EU students the insurance from their home country will be accepted. Medical service is available for citizens from EU countries who have the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a replacement certificate. The EHIC (valid for the whole period of student's stay at CUT) allows getting state healthcare at a reduced cost or sometimes for free.

More information at Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia – NFZ (National Health Fund)- (ul. Batorego 24, Cracow) or at www.nfz.gov.pl. On this matter, at CUT you can contact your chosen Faculty department.

Non-EU students are required to have a commercial medical insurance (bought in their home country before arriving or just after arrival in Poland, valid for the whole period of student's stay at CUT). Insurance should cover not only accidents but also general practitioner's consultation.

If you are a regular student you can use medical care in Scanmed medical Centre, on ul. Warszawska 24 (Faculty of Chemical Engineering and Technology building), in case of emergency phone number: +48 12 628 30 40.

ACCOMMODATION IN CRACOW

If you need a short-term accommodation on your arrival, you can initially stay in a hotel or in a youth hostel.

OUR DORMITORIES

In general, at CUT there are about 2400 places in 5 dormitories with single, double and triple rooms or apartments to choose from, located at the Czyżyny campus and at Bydgoska Str. Each dormitory has a room for individual study and a self-service laundry.

To rent a room before your arrival in Cracow, you should submit (Application Form for Exchange Students – Accommodation) to the Students Exchange Office at CUT before 30 May, regardless of whether you are planning to start your study period at our university in the winter or spring semester of the following academic year.

Equipment of a residence hall

The rooms are furnished with beds, chairs, tables, wardrobes, bed-clothes and 1 food cabinet. There is also an Internet connection and a cable TV connection in each room. You can use the Internet connection for free; all you need is your own computer or notebook.

Take note that the place in CUT dormitory can't be chosen, it's assigned by Student Housing authority. For information about accommodation please visit: ds.pk.edu.pl

Transport

You can get to the dormitories by bus number 129 from the main university building (direction: Dworzec Czyżyny). If you arrive in Cracow by plane, you need to take bus number 292 first (or train to the bus/railway station) and then change to bus number 129. In both cases, you need to get off eventually at the bus stop: ul. Okulickiego.

Accommodation cost

The fees are set for approximately 310 PLN per person per month (Internet is included and available in all residence halls).

Take note that not every international student could be provided with dormitory place.

First year international students can be awarded a place on a student hall from a reserve pool at the disposal of Rector.

RENTING A FLAT

If dormitory life isn't for you there is also some alternative: a private apartment/

flat. You can rent a room in a flat shared with other students or rent the whole flat for yourself. If you are considering renting an apartment/flat in its entirety, the average price is as follows: a double room apartment/flat starts from 1300 zł, a single room apartment/flat from 1000 zł. Sometimes landlords ask for deposit or additional payments (electricity, gas, heating).

CLIMATE

The climate in Poland is maritime and sometimes continental determined by the geographical location. It means warm summers and cold winters. The seasons are clearly differentiated. In the mountains the snow lies till April or some years even May. The ski season runs from December to March.

Polish currency is the ZŁOTY (zł, PLN). 1 zloty divides into 100 groszy.

You can change foreign currency at banks or in exchange offices marked "Kantor". The rates are always listed outside and may slightly vary between different exchange offices. Please do not accept exchange offers from strangers.

ATMs are available, where the sign 'Bankomat' indicates them. Banks are open Monday to Friday from 9am to 5pm and some are open on Saturday till 1pm.

TIME ZONE

The time zone is CET=GMT+1 (GMT + 2 from last Sunday in March to last Sunday in October).

The airport is located about 11 km (7 miles) from the centre of the city, which could be reached by public bus or taxi.

GETTING TO THE CITY FROM THE AIRPORT BY PUBLIC BUS

Directly between the airport and the city center runs municipal busses number 208 and 292. They leave from the roundabout in front of the passenger terminal, ferrying passengers regularly to the centre.

292 (runs every 20 minutes), 208 (runs once an hour), and 902 (night bus service between 11pm and 4am, runs every hour).

You can take these busses directly to the University (take off at: Politechnika, for the main campus). Taking one night line: 902 (take off at: Dworzec Główny). Tickets can be purchased from:

- the ticket machine at the bus stop (payment in cash or with credit/debit card),
- the authorized ticket machines found on 292 line buses (payment in cash – coins only),
- the bus driver, in case of lack or failure of ticket machine (single tickets only, payment in cash).

Note: The ticket must be bought before travel and validated after getting on the bus.

By train

The Central Railway Station – *Krakow Główny* is situated in the very city centre, approx. 10 minutes walk from the Market Square. Ticket offices are open between 5am and 11pm. Every day there departs trains to Berlin, Vienna, Prague and Budapest. The most convenient is the express service to and from Warsaw. The 300-km trip takes 2h45, no stops in between. 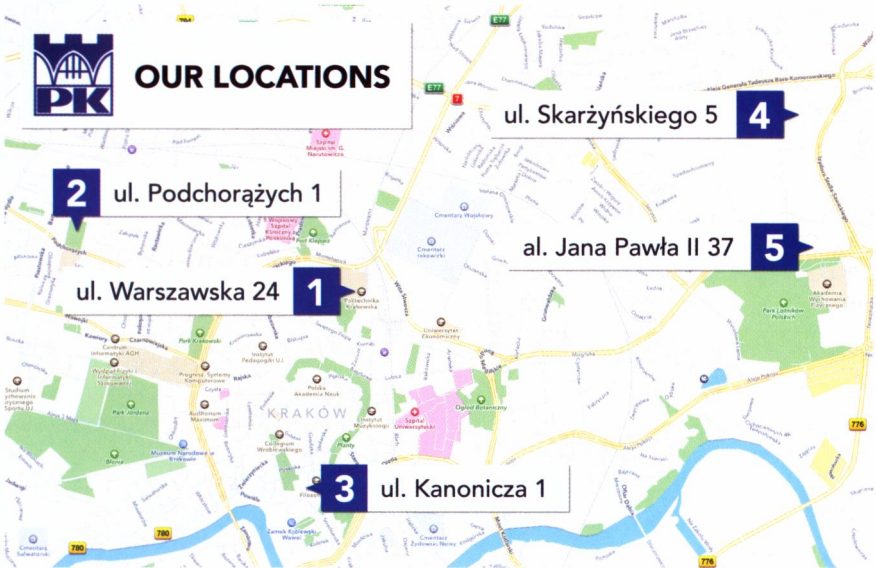

ABOUT CRACOW



Cracow is the capital of the Malopolska region, the metropolitan centre of the Cracow agglomeration and an important European metropolis. Being the second city in Poland in terms of size and population, Cracow is divided into 18 districts.

Cracow is a city with a history of more than a thousand years which you can actually feel when you are walking charming streets and lanes. For several centuries, Cracow was the capital of Poland, with the Wawel Royal Castle playing the role of the seat of the monarchs of Poland until the end of the 16th century. The castle cathedral witnessed 37 coronation ceremonies and holds the remains of Polish monarchs, heroes and poets as one of the greatest Polish Parthenon's. In the Middle Ages, one of the major European administration

and trade centres. An important religious, cultural, academic and crafts centre in the 15th and the 16th centuries. The 1257 founding charter based on the Magdeburg Law specified the city's new urban plan, with a centrally located Main Square and a regular chequered pattern of streets running from it. The Main Square was the largest and one of the most impressive in medieval Europe: each of its sides is 200 m long. It has been preserved in an unmodified shape and is still the heart of the city. In 1978, the Main Square and the surrounding chequered pattern of streets were included on the first UNESCO World Heritage List, and in 2005 came first in the World's Best Squares ranking held by the Project for Public Spaces.

The medieval town was surrounded with a fortifications complex, with the Barbican, fragments of city walls with St. Florian's Gate and several towers. A unique park, Planty, was created in the 19th century in place of city walls, embankments and moats, encircling the oldest part of the city.

The tourists are always amazed by the Royal Route, which leads from the main entrance gate (St. Florian's Gate) to the Royal Wawel Castle at Wawel Hill. The Route was taken by the Polish monarchs when ceremonially entering the city and during coronations and funerals. Thanks to the *Royal Route for Disabled Tourists* project, the Route may also be discovered by people with visual impairments and the disabled. Under the project, 12 bronze models offering a tactile experience of the most popular Cracow sights (the Barbican, St. Mary's Basilica, the Cloth Hall, St. Andrew's and St. Peter and Paul's churches and Wawel

Hill) have been produced. The models have inscriptions in Braille (in Polish and in English) and the plinths of the models are designed in such a way so as to enable persons in wheelchairs to come as close as possible.

KAZIMIERZ AND PODGÓRZE DISTRICTS

Kazimierz, once a separate town, founded in 1335, today a district of Cracow, offers the unique atmosphere of a centuries-old coexistence of two cultures: Jewish and Christian. By the 17th century Jewish life was flourishing and numerous synagogues had been constructed when the plague hit in 1651. Four years later Kazimierz was ransacked by Swedish invaders, famine, floods and anti-Jewish riots followed in quick succession, and a mass migration to Warsaw began, leaving the once vibrant Kazimierz a shadow of its former self.

In 1796 Cracow came under Austrian control, and four years later Kazimierz was incorporated into its neighbouring city. The governing Austrians also ordered all of Cracow's Jews to resettle in Kazimierz, and a rich cultural life arose around them; by 1910 the Jewish population stood at 32,000, a figure that was to nearly double during the inter-war years. This ended with the Nazi occupation of Cracow and Hitler's systematic extermination of the Jews of Europe. A mere 3-5,000 survived the Holocaust, a large proportion of them saved by Oskar Schindler.



Nowadays Kazimierz, a space full of Judaist historical monuments of world importance, currently plays an important role of cultural life in Cracow, full of galleries, antiques and works of art, fairs, live music in local pubs and restaurants. Neighbouring Podgórze district, on the other side of the Vistula river is full of greenery, mystery, a cosy atmosphere and modern museums, also draws attention and is easily accessible from Kazimierz through the Father Laetus Bernatek footbridge, where you can find many nice pubs and cafés.

NOWA HUTA DISTRICT

The other interesting from historical point of view Nowa Huta, the fullest and most interesting realisation of social realism architects' plans, is an intriguing district. Nowa Huta is one of the finest examples of deliberate social engineering in the world. Built to impress, Nowa Huta featured wide, tree-lined avenues, parks, lakes and the official architectural style of the time - Socialist Realism. Nowa Huta's architects strove to construct the ideal city, it was a massive task, with volunteer workers flocking from across Poland to take part in this bold project.

The Utopian dream that was Nowa Huta was never fully realised. A town hall in the style of the renaissance halls was never built, nor was the theatre building across from it and the ornamental architectural details planned for the monumental buildings of Plac Centralny were never added. Nevertheless, Nowa Huta is a must see district, especially for those who are

interested in a history of architecture, or building engineering. Nowa Huta may have been designed to be a socialist showcase city, but it soon became a centre of anti-communist activity and played a huge part in the Solidarity strikes of the early 1980s. Nowadays there are wide plans of revitalization this district in order to strengthen its social and urban potential.

THEATRES

Cracow is known as a Poland's capital of culture and it's a home to the most active national theatre scenes. In Cracow it is running the oldest theatre in Poland - Stary Teatr (National Old Theatre) which was founded in 1798. It has some significant local competitor – Slowacki Theatre which has been continuously staging plays since 1893. Moreover annually at the beginning of July takes place the International Festival of Street Theatres, the oldest festival of this kind in central Europe.

CINEMAS

There are some small historic cinemas like Pod Baranami (Rynek Główny 27) and ARS (ul. św. Tomasza 11). For the latest Hollywood releases you'll have to visit one of the shopping mall multiplexes like Cinema City in Galeria Kazimierz (ul. Podgórska 34). Tickets cost 15-25zł. There are also some significant discounts at the independent cinemas, especially during summer film cycles – then the ticket costs 6zł.

FESTIVALS

The variety of different kinds of festivals in Malopolska region is vast, you'll get a more sophisticated selection of venues, exposing Cracow's cultural depth. We present you electro music, sounds of church organs, jazz, off music, shanties, medieval or Jewish music. Moreover you can be part of events such like tolerance festival, photomonth, Sacrum Profanum music festival. In addition there are some food fests like Najedzeni Fest where you can try cuisine from all over the world, or for example pierogi fest or international soup fest. The festival calendar includes annual standouts like the Street Theatre Festival, Jewish Culture Festival and the Cracow Film Festival, offset by more eccentric endeavours like the annual Dragon and Dachshund Parades (respectively), and the most important students' festival - Juwenalia.

Apart of music festivals there are many music venues varying from huge Cracow arena to intimate bars, pubs and night clubs, where every night crowds of people have a good time. Estery 5) or see what's on in Forty Kleparz (ul Kamienna 2), Lizard King (ul. Św. Tomasza 11A) and Studio Klub (ul. Budryka 4).

RELIGION

Poland is a catholic country since 7th century, in present about 90% of Poles are Roman Catholics, although this number may be overestimated as the statistics often include people who were baptised Catholic, even if they later abandoned the Church. Anyway, the Catholics make the most significant religious group and this religion is a subject studied at school, even though this is not obligatory. Cracow is a unique place for Catholics because

of Karol Wojtyła was born in Wadowice near Cracow and who learned and lived in Cracow until he became the Pope John Paul II, proclaimed a saint in 2014. That's why Cracow is a very popular destination among pilgrims from all over the world.

"If there wasn't Rome, Cracow would be Rome". At present, seven saints, eight blessed persons, and a similar number of people believed to have been saints are buried in the churches of Cracow. The last twenty-five years have been a special time for Cracow in this respect – saint Pope John Paul II canonised or beatified eight persons whose life was related to Cracow, and whose tombs are in the Cracow churches. Cracow is a city of churches – there are over 120 shrines in the city – not only breathtaking temples but also great monuments of architectural styles known from Roman period, through gothic, baroque, classicism and others modern ones.

LOCAL TRANSPORT

Cracow is a compact city and all the main sights are easily accessible on foot. Nevertheless, there are efficient, affordable an integrated bus and tram services operated by MPK SA. Public transport operates seven days a week, from 5.00am until 11.00pm. There are also night bus lines that operate until dawn, though much less frequently. Their numbers always start with 6. You can also use two night trams (lines number 64 and 69). Be sure to check the timetables at the relevant stops.

Tickets for these services need to be pre-purchased. A ticket for the public transportation network permits travel on trams and busses. Tickets are valid for a particular time period. Apart from the regular municipal tickets you could purchase so-called network ticket, a season ticket for from 1 month to 1 year for one, two or all routes. No luggage fares are required.

Ticket validation: it is necessary to validate your ticket immediately after entering the vehicle in the orange machine located inside trams and busses.

You can buy tickets:

- at some kiosks;
- from ticket vending machines (multiple language options are available);
- from ticket vending machines on many buses and trams (ticket machines in vehicles accept coins only);
- from bus or tram drivers (if you buy a ticket onboard the bus or tram, exact change is required);
- in the seasonal tickets sales office e.g. at ul. Podwale 3/5.
